




#### Fiction Author Spotlight: Beatriz Williams

Along the Infinite Sea A Certain Age The Golden Hour A Hundred Summers The Summer Wives Tiny Little Thing


According to the publisher, Williams' latest novel, *Her Last Flight*, explores "the story of a lost pilot and a wartime

photographer that will leave its mark on your soul."






### The Light of Days by Judy Batalion


#### One by One by Aaron Berkowitz


#### The Book of Rosy by Rosayra Pablo Cruz


#### Exercise of Power by Robert M. Gates

"Gessen not only highlights the corrosion of the media, the judiciary, and the cultural norms we hoped would save us but also tells us the story of how a short few years have changed us."




