2020 Budget + Library Trustee Vote

Middletown Thrall Library, located at 11-19 Depot Street Middletown, NY, 10940 will holding a **2020 Public Budget Vote and Trustee Election on Tuesday, October 15, 2019**. The vote will be held in the **Library's Reading Room** between the hours of **8 AM – 8:00 PM**. Residents of the Library District will vote on the proposed 2020 gross operating budget in the amount of \$3,795,595.00. The proposed budget will increase the tax levy by \$113,100 or 3.2% over the previous year.

There are **two seats on the Library's Board of Trustees** that are subject to a vote this year with terms commencing in 2020. Interested candidates must have one (1) year residency in the district immediately preceding the date of the annual meeting and election. Such petitions must be signed by at least fifty (50) qualified voters of the Library District, shall state the residence address of each signer, and the name and residence address of the candidate. Trustee terms are for four years. Nominating petitions may be picked up from the director's office at Middletown Thrall Library between the hours of 9:00am -4:00pm Monday through Friday. Completed nominating petitions must be filed with the Director's Office at the Library by no later than **4 PM on September 17, 2019**.

Those who wish to vote early **before the Library is open** (between 8 AM and 9 AM) can enter the Library from one of two entrances located on the **Depot Street** side of the building. All registered voters who reside in the Thrall Public Library District are eligible to vote. This includes residents of the Enlarged City School District of Middletown, residents of the Town of Mt. Hope who reside within the Pine Bush Central School District, and residents of the Town of Wallkill who reside within the Pine Bush Central School District, Valley Central School District, or Minisink Valley Central School District.

We recently added these **five Salem Press reference works** in our **Reference** section (descriptions provided by the publisher):

Defining Documents in American History: The Gun Debate (2 volumes; call number: **363.33 GUN**)

"This volume analyzes documents that have played a significant role in the attempt to balance the long tradition of gun culture in this country with calls for gun control, including: The Second Amendment; St. George Tucker, Blackstone's *Commentaries*; *No Treason* by Lysander Spooner; *U.S. v. Miller*; *District of Columbia v. Heller* and *Firearms in America: Personal Liberty versus Collective Responsibility*."

Defining Documents in American History: Slavery (2 volumes; call number: **306.362 SLA**)

This title "delves into the extremely long and violent history of the titular subject. These volumes discuss slavery in multiple contexts, from ancient times to the slave trade during colonial America, and from the abolitionist movement to issues of slavery in the modern era."

Infectious Diseases & Conditions

(3 volumes; call number: **616.9 INF**)

"An A-Z encyclopedia covering all aspects of infectious diseases and their prevention, offering historical and technical background with a balanced discussion of discoveries, developments, and prognoses."

Principles of Ecology (call number: **577 PRI**)

"In 110 articles, this title considers how organizations of the same species interact with each other, how organisms of different species in the same space interact, and how multiple communities interact to make up an ecosystem, information crucial in understanding how biodiversity affects ecological function."

Principles of Modern Agriculture (call number: **630 PRI**)

"This volume provides new ways to think about and study issues, policies and practices in today's agricultural production."

These titles are **shelved numerically** according to their respective **call numbers** above. A librarian can help you locate any of these!
