Whether you want to do some **research**, explore **employment opportunities**, prepare a **resumé**, develop a **flyer** or a **presentation**, or simply check your e-mail or browse the Web, we encourage you to take advantage of the **power** and **speed** of these new computers!

We also created a mini *Microsoft Office* support library at Reference so you can learn more about *Microsoft Word*, *Excel*, *PowerPoint*, *Publisher*, etc.. Circulating copies of these books are also available in our regular collection!

Mobile Government Apps apps.usa.gov

"Government apps and mobile sites offer official information and services from the palm of your hand." According to the **Government Printing Office** (www.gpo.gov), over 21 million publications were harvested from thirty-nine government agency websites between 2012 and 2014. "Harvested" — now that's an interesting new word representing a novel way of accessing information in a constantly growing digital world!

To help you access much of that incredible information, we invite you to check out our very own Government Information portal at **www.thrall.org/gov** and to explore the many free apps available from your government.

GPO has developed apps allowing users to access **Congressional publications** like the *Congressional Pictorial Directory*, the *Budget of the United States*, the *Plum Book* (information on presidentially appointed positions), and the **Daily Compilation of Presidential Documents**.

Useful apps developed by other government agencies can be accessed through USA.gov's **Mobile Apps Gallery** - **http://apps.usa.gov** - there are apps for *everyone!*

For example, check out the *Alternative Fuel Station Locator* app that helps you find fueling stations that offer electricity, natural gas, biodiesel, E85, propane, or hydrogen, or the **National Library of Medicine's** *MyMedList*, which helps you keep track of daily medications.

CDC offers *Healthy Swimming*, an app answering questions about where we swim (and the germs possibly lurking in the water), as well as *Solve the Outbreak*, which lets you play the *disease detective!*

NASA's *Space Place Prime* app connects you with the *Astronomy Picture of the Day*; while **MilitaryOneSource** helps servicemen find potentially useful resources.

The Justice Department's FBI.gov Mobile alerts you to the Most Wanted List.

The **U.S. Census Bureau's** *dwellr* **app** helps you discover the top **25 U.S. cities and towns** that best fit *your* lifestyle.

The FCC **Speed Test** app measures your **mobile broadband performance** and displays an in-depth view of its factors.
